Land and Survey Records in the Archives of the Board of Commissioners of Public Lands Presented by Randy L. Bixby



The May meeting will be held on Thursday, May 7^{th,} at the Lussier Family Heritage Center*, 3101 Lake Farm Rd, Madison, WI.

Bixby is the Land Records Archivist of the Board of Commissioners of Public Lands (BCPL), the oldest state agency in Wisconsin.

The BCPL Archives holds the original survey maps and field notes for the entire state of Wisconsin, and records relating to land grants from the federal government to the State of Wisconsin, totaling 10 million acres.

This presentation will provide background information on the original surveys of Wisconsin and an overview of federal and state land patents and their impact on the people of Wisconsin.

*This will be the first of hopefully a periodic occurrence of joint meetings with the Dane County Historical Society. The doors open at 6:30 with refreshments served at that time (members are welcome to bring homemade treats) and presentation starts at 7:00 pm sharp.

Most of us have used BadgerLink at one time or another, but I was pleasantly surprised how easy it is to navigate this newly designed site. Congratulations!

Your library card from any Wisconsin library gives you online access to www.BadgerLink.net, from here you can explore valuable genealogical sources from your home or library. BadgerLink, already a valuable resource for genealogy, recently has been expanded to include new features in HeritageQuest Online (HQO) such as expanded census, military records, and full textbooks.

Ms. Ripley engaged the DCAGS audience by describing some of the new features of HeritageQuest Online.

The Treasure Box, a feature of Access NewspaperArchive (ANA), another service you can access through BadgerLink elicited much interest and questions.

Answers to some follow-up questions are:

- You MUST create an account to use Treasure Box.
- You CANNOT download ALL the items in the Box at once.
- ITEMS in your Box remain there until you DELETE them.
- NO international records in HQO. Only U.S. records, books, city directories.
- SOME Civil War records appear in HQO, but PERSI is a better source.
- Ms. Riley sent a file showing the OVERLAP between ANA and Newspapers.com; if you'd like a copy email Walker.
- Name searching: enter an inclusive name search "john Smith" if you are searching "John Z. Smith" only, include middle initial.

There is much to discover on this website. Explore to enrich your genealogy.
